On behalf of Members of the committee on Selection and pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order No.42 and 153, it is my pleasure and duty to present to the House the committee's report on restructuring, creation, placement of Members to various Sectoral committees.

Always in- attendance we have the Speaker and the Clerk.

Mr. Speaker, the Committee draws its mandate from the Standing Order No.153 which provides how that committee should carry its operations.

Mr. Speaker Sir, the committee sat on the Wednesday 25<sup>th</sup> and Thursday 26<sup>th</sup> July 2018.

The Committee on selection based their nomination of the following criteria: priority and preference, gender and special representation, balancing of sub-counties, voting, professional qualifications, experience, skill and expertise. The proposed County Assembly committees are

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as follows.

Mr. Speaker Sir, I will read all the committees because some other committees have changed their names. We will have the Committee on Agriculture; we will have a Committee on Livestock Development and Fisheries,; Devolution and Public Administration; Public Service Management; Finance and Economic Planning; Education, Culture and Vocational Training - it is not Social Services - ; Youth Affairs and Sports; then we have Health Services; ICT and E-Government; Trade and Industrialization; Cooperative and Enterprise Development; Lands and Housing; Physical Planning and Urban Development; Roads, Transport, Energy and Public Works; Water, Environment and Natural Resources; Tourism and Wildlife Management; Gender; Culture, Social Services and Welfare.

The Select committees: Committee on Implementation, Committee on Budget and Appropriation, County Public Accounts Committee, County Assembly Business Committee, Committee on Public Investment. The other committees that will remain: Committee on Delegated Legislation; Security Justice and Legal Affairs; County Assembly Procedure and rules; Committee on Appointment; Liaison Committee and the Committee on Powers and Privileges.

Mr. Speaker Sir, pursuant to Standing Order No. 154; that states; ‘unless otherwise provided by any written law or the Standing Orders, the Committee on Selection Shall in consultation with the County Assembly parties nominate Members who shall serve on the Select Committee.’ It is in this regard that a change has been made in the Speaker’s Panel.

The Committee restructured a number of Sectoral Committees by either adding more Members to the existing sectoral committees or by splitting some into two for effective delivery of services. The Committees that have been split into two are: Water, Environment and Natural Resources; Tourism and Wildlife Management; Public Accounts and Public Investment; Committee on Youth and Sports; Gender, Culture, Social Services Committee.

The above committees were split into: Water, Environment, Natural Resources Committee; Tourism, Wildlife Management; Public Accounts Committee; Public Investment Committee; Youth and Sports Committee; Gender, Culture, Social Services and Welfare Committee.

Mr. Speaker Sir, the committees that Members were added are: Delegated Legislation because they had less Members; Devolution and Public Administration; ICT and E-Government.

Mr. Speaker Sir, the leadership of the said Committees is hereby proposed as follows. This is after the election of the same committees.

Mr. Speaker Sir, Delegated and Legislation Committee: The Chairperson-elect is Honourable Patrick Bundotich and the deputy is Honourable Gilbert Bett; Devolution and Public Administration Committee, the Chair-elect is Honourable Samwel Choge deputized by Honourable Eileen Kendagor; ICT and E-Government, the Chair-elect is Honourable Peter Chomba deputized by Honourable Jenny Too; Water, Environment and Natural Resources Committee; the Chair-elect is Honourable Hillary Rono, deputized by Honourable Isaac Kemboi; Tourism and Wildlife Management Committee, the Chair-elect is Honourable Gilbert Bett, deputized by Honourable Hosea Korir; Public Accounts Committee, the Chair-elect is Honourable Ramadhan Ali, deputized by Honourable Mary Goretti Boroswa; Public Investment

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Committee, the Chair is Honourable Philip Melly, deputized by Honourable Julius Sang; Youth and Sports Committee, the Chair is Honourable Edward Yego, deputized by Honourable Leah Malot; Gender, Culture, Social Services and Welfare, Chair is Honourable Francis Muya, deputized by again Honourable Eileen Kendagor.

Mr. Speaker Sir, the above committees were clustered into six clusters and each Member is placed in one committee of each cluster in order to ease scheduling of attendance by Members for efficiency and performance in committees.

The clusters are as follows:

Cluster one: Roads, Health, Lands and Agriculture. Cluster two: Livestock Development and Fisheries; Environment, Water and Natural Resources; Trade and Industrialization; Devolution and Public Administration. Cluster three is: Education and Vocational Training; Public Service Management; ICT and E-Government; Physical Planning and Urban Development. Cluster Four: Budget and Appropriation; Finance and Economic Planning; Implementation; and Public Accounts Committee. Cluster five: Security, Justice and Legal Affairs; Cooperatives and Enterprise Development; Delegated and Legislation; and House Business Committee. Cluster six: Youth and Sports; Gender, Culture, Social Services and Welfare; Public Investment Committee; Tourism and Wildlife Management.

The ad hoc Committees are as: Powers and Privileges Committee; Procedure and Rules Committee; Committee on Selection and Delegated Legislation. Now Delegated has come into two; now we will have an amendment as a Committee later because it appears in cluster five and as ad-hoc, it should not appear as an ad-hoc committee.

Honourable Members, the Select Committee deliberated comprehensively and in detail and eventually nominated the Members to the various assembly committees as shown in the attached schedule.

Mr. Speaker Sir, that schedule I think will be distributed to Members. Members had the report; every Member has a report on the committees and the Membership of those committees.

*(Consultations)*

Mr. Speaker, we have the report and all Members were issued with the report. It has the committees and the Membership. Mr. Speaker Sir, also this report I am tabling it before the House, Mr. Mr. Speaker Sir, the committee recommends that this County Assembly adopts its fourth report on Restructuring, Creation and Placement of Members to various Sectoral committees without amendments.

Mr. Speaker Sir, the Committee as directed by you yesterday burnt the mid-night oil, woke up very early today to make sure that all Members are placed in the committees they want to serve in. The Committee has done quite a recommendable job; the Committee has even clustered and made sure that a Member is in one cluster at any time. I am asking this House, kindly approve this report without amendments so that it can give Members in this House the appropriate time to serve in the committees they have been nominated to.

Mr. Speaker Sir, the driver of the business of this County or any other County or the national government is by the committees. The respective committees, when they become strong and

they do their work in oversight and representation, we will really push the other side; the second arm of the government which is the Executive to perform their duties, and also these committees can approve all the other policies; all the other plans like the ADP, the CIDP, the CFSP as tabled to this House.

Mr. Speaker Sir, without much ado, I want to ask Members that these positions you have been given - or elected as a Chair, elected as a deputy Chair, elected to serve in that committee - kindly take it seriously because it is not a matter of you being there; it is a matter of you discharging your duties. It is the matter of you showing your worth; it is a matter of you making sure that things are done the right way.

Mr. Speaker Sir, I want to call upon Honourable Hosea Some to second.

#### ADJOURNMENT OF HOUSE SITTINGS

*(Hon. Josphat Lowoi – Leader of Government Business)*

**Deputy Speaker:** Honourable Leader of Government business, Honourable Lowoi!

**Hon. Lowoi:** Thank you very much, Mr. Speaker Sir. Allow me move the following Motion:

That this House do adjourn its sittings in terms of Standing Order No. 25 (3) and its adopted Calendar for a period of 39 days starting on 27<sup>th</sup> July, 2018 to 3<sup>rd</sup> September, 2018, both days inclusive, as indicated in the Uasin Gishu County Assembly Calendar.

Mr. Speaker Sir, we approved a Calendar in this House in the first session when we came and this Calendar is a plan that we use. Now it has come to a day that we should proceed for our recess for 39 days; it is one of the longest recesses that we have. But keeping in mind, according to the schedule of events that are ahead of us, it also seen that we will be busy throughout August, some Members will be visiting schools for prayer days and visiting their children who are candidates in primary and secondary schools. Some of us have never visited our relatives

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since we were elected and the relatives have started cursing us. This is the time that we should go there and tell them that now you are Honourable Member and you go there in a suit.

Mr. Speaker Sir, most of us are farmers and because we have been busy in this County Assembly, our farms have deteriorated and our cows have died, our homesteads are now grassy, we need to go back home, put on your short, take a slasher and make your compound clean.

Some of us are businessmen, but we have left our businesses to other people and now the businesses are running at a loss. It is a time that we should go and sit there for two days and see what is happening.

More importantly, it is time for Honourable Members to go and interact with their electorates. This is the time that we are going to pick the issues that are affecting our people in the ground. This is the actual time that we are going to sit down and listen to them, have *barazas* and when we come back on 3<sup>rd</sup> September, we will have issues from the ground; we will have priorities from the ground. As we prepare to start receiving money from the national government and also the one we are collecting locally and starting to spend the same until we begin to implement the budget, that is the time now when we will have those issues at hand.

Mr. Speaker Sir, it is also an opportunity for us to go and tell our people what is in the CIDP, ADP and the budget. You know, once we were elected and nominated, our people expect that we do everything at the same time, but when we go back home, our Members will be able to tell the members of the public that we are able in this budget to do one, two, three things that are in the budget and those in the ADP, CIDP, and that will give us ease as Members will understand our plans and what we intend to do.

Mr. Speaker Sir, this is an opportunity for also some of us ... I was speaking to my friend Honourable Chomba and he said since election, he has never rested and he is thinking of taking a vacation to Dubai. Maybe this is the time that you will have that time without a lot of issues around you, but do not go too long because you are required by your electorates.

Mr. Speaker Sir, without saying much, this is a timetable that was approved by this House; there is no amendment and I expect that all of us should support this. Let us go home; let us build our families; let us see what we are supposed to do; let us visit the electorates. For some of us who have been around town, let us go back to the village, let us mingle with these people who employed us to come here. This is a noble time that all of us should now have time to do other things that pertains our life.

Mr. Speaker Sir, I want to call upon Honourable Gilbert Tenai of Cheptiret/Kipchamo Ward, who is also the deputy Whip, to second.

**Deputy Speaker:** Honourable Tenai!

**Hon. Tenai:** Thank you, Mr. Speaker Sir. I want to second the Motion moved by the Honourable Leader of Majority towards the adjournment of this House. I know the month of August; though the recess will be a long period, there will be a lot of activities considering the fact that we are supposed to participate in the KICOSCA/CASA games which are coming up from August 12 and we are supposed to go for some training. I believe the Honourable Members are well prepared for the same event. So, I welcome all the Members of this Honourable House to go there and practise very well so that when we will be competing with other County

### ELECTION OF DEPUTY LEADER OF MAJORITY

**Deputy Speaker:** You have concluded. If there is no any other contribution over the same, Honourable Members, I seek your indulgence and do one communication that we have just received some few minutes ago. This is addressed to the Speaker. This is from the Chief Whip on party meeting to elect Deputy Majority Leader. The following Members offered their candidature: Honourable Julius Sang, Honourable Mary Goretti Boroswa, Honourable Leah Malot and the results were as follows Honourable Members: Honourable Julius Sang got 25 votes, Honourable Mary Goretti got 0 vote and Honourable Leah Malot 2 votes. There was none in terms of spoilt votes, Honourable Members, and the total votes cast were 27. Therefore, Honourable Members, Honourable Julius Sang emerged victorious after garnering 25 votes out of 27 casted votes.
